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Wee Drummers is a fully equipped childcare facility with an outdoor play area and qualified staff. We are fully compliant with the HSE regulations and work closely with Monaghan County Childcare Committee. We are also members of Early Childhood Ireland.

In Wee Drummers we provide children with a curriculum which includes a range of activities such as arts and crafts, science, maths and messy play.

We encourage children to learn together through small group activities. This allows children to learn new concepts and skills, it also enables them to experience both challenges and skills.

There are many areas for the children in Wee Drummers to explore and develop.



The book corner gives the children time to rest, read and to sing songs. Clones Library van visits our facility twice a month which is a great opportunity for the children to lend books and learn to take care of them.

The **Dress up** corner allows the children to reach in to their creative side and act out role play with each other. This comes in useful when we perform **plays for the parents** twice a year.



We also have many construction toys, farm and road vehicles, animals, dolls, kitchen area, sand and water play, blocks and jigsaws of varying difficulties.



The **Outdoor play** area which has a safety surface has numerous outdoor toys such as tractors and bikes. This outdoor area allows the children to interact with their peers which in turn improves their social skills. We find that it is when they are outdoors that children are most curious and this is encouraged through **nature walks**.
